

Wonders of the World Powerpoint
6th Grade Reading Project

1. Select a Wonder of the World group off of the websites.
2. Most of the sites have 7 wonders listed. If the site you chose has more pick only 7 that you would like to do.
3. You will need 4 slides for each wonder.
4. Your first slide should contain the name of the wonder and a picture.
5. At least one of the other 3 slides must contain information. This should be written in bullet form not sentences. Possible suggestions for this slide depends on your category. You could include the location. If it is man-made you might include the builder and/or the year of completion. Another suggestion would be what it is used for. If it is a natural or underwater wonder you might include what is special or unusual about it. For example it might be the tallest fall, the longest river, the highest mountain peak, it might contain unusual vegetation or animals. These are only suggestions. Your actual information will depend on what it is. Whatever you put should have something to do with why it is a wonder. You should not put more than 2 or 3 bullets on the slide.
6. The other 2 slides should include pictures, more information, or a picture with additional information.
7. Since we are studying text structure I would like you to follow the same format for each wonder. This will give order to your presentation and make it simpler for people to understand your presentation. What this means is you will follow the same pattern. (An example would be Slide 1 – Name and picture, Slide 2 - Another picture, Slide 3 - Information 2 or 3 bullets, Slide 4 – a picture.)
8. You will share your presentation with the class.
9. This project will probably take 3-4 weeks. It is very important that you don't get behind. We have computer every Monday. If you are absent or serving or missing for any reason you must sign up to go to the computer lab at recess.
10. This project will be graded on how it is set up, the quality of the information you have in your bullets, and the overall appearance of your final project.
