

School News



- ❖ Welcome to all of our new students and their families! We are happy you have joined our St. Teresa family. To all of our returning students and families, welcome back!
- ❖ We extend a very warm welcome to our new faculty members: Fourth grade teacher, Mrs. Mandy Thatcher and Music teacher, Miss Madison Vonderahe.
- ❖ This year's school theme is "Faith Can Move Mountains". This theme will be incorporated throughout the school year. Special thanks to Mrs. Ostertag's sister who came up with the design to accompany our theme.
- ❖ Monday we will begin our first full week of school. A reminder that our start time for the 2021-22 school year is **7:40 am. The doors WILL NOT BE UNLOCKED until 7:15 am.** First and Second grade students must enter the school through the front primary doors. Kindergarten, third through eighth should enter using the front and courtyard doors. Students who arrive after school begins should go directly to the school office for a tardy slip. Our dismissal procedure begins at 2:12.
- ❖ St. Teresa utilizes many forms of communicating with our families. One is our weekly newsletter, the Bruin Bulletin. It is emailed to parents on Thursdays. If you do not have access to email, please contact the school office. Today's Bruin was emailed. Please check to be sure you received it. If you did not receive it via email, please call the school office. Next week's Bruin will be emailed only. We have had parents experiencing difficulty receiving our emails if they have Hotmail. Please be sure to add St. Teresa as a contact. Also, check your "Spam" folder; as sometimes it ends up going there.
- ❖ St. Teresa's calendar is available on Google, as well as a copy that will be included in the last Bruin Bulletin of every month. Since we communicate using email, please keep the office informed of any change in email. You may also visit our website at www.stteresa.net. Also, like us on Facebook to follow information updates and show your school spirit. St. Teresa PTG, Art and Athletics also have Facebook pages to like.
- ❖ Option C is the on-line grading system that St. Teresa uses to complete your beginning of year forms and to daily view your child's grades. You should logon with information that was given to you in your beginning year packet. Please update your information on Option C if there is any change throughout the year; as well as contacting the school office so we can update our records.
- ❖ **Please be sure that all of your child's forms have been completed through Option C and any hard copy forms returned to school by tomorrow, Friday, August 20th.**
- ❖ Quarter zip sweatshirt orders are due by September 10.

- ❖ New this year on Gym days, students are to wear the school's gym uniform. Students should wear their gym uniform to school on gym days. They will wear it for the entire day. If you do not yet have your gym uniform yet, please send your child in appropriate shorts and tshirt.
- ❖ This is the last call for ordering gym uniforms. If you have not ordered yet, please see the attached order form which is due tomorrow. When uniforms arrive in September, they will be sent home with your child. Consequences for being out of uniform for gym will begin October 1 so please be sure to order at least the tshirt and shorts now.
- ❖ Please read the attached letter from the principal and nurse.
- ❖ We are aware of problems with the bus. We submitted all of your request forms in June before the due date and resent them again the beginning of August. We are in contact with Cincinnati Public Transportation and First Student. Feel free to call CPS at 363-7433 to inquire about your child's transportation.

Spirit Days

St. Teresa School hosts two kinds of Spirit Days. The second Thursday of the month will be our **ESAP Tuition Assistance Out of Uniform Day**. For a charge of \$2, a student may come to school out of uniform (in appropriate attire as outlined in the Student Handbook). This is a way to earn money for tuition assistance which is disbursed to our school families who need a little help.

For .25 a student may come out of uniform; however, they must wear some kind of St. Teresa spirit wear (St. Teresa Tshirt, St. Teresa sports jersey, a green or white Tshirt). 

Hello Bruin Families!

Welcome back to school! As we prepare for what may come with this pandemic, which is a challenge because the virus is still unpredictable, we are offered many resources from our local and state health departments for our new academic year. Attached you will find the flowchart provided by the Ohio Department of Health, and supported by the Cincinnati Health Department, regarding the quarantine procedures we follow if we have a positive COVID case in the classroom.

So, what's changed since last year?

Students 12 years and older are now eligible to receive the COVID-19 vaccination. This, as well as the reduction of mask-wearing and distancing, creates a change in our contact tracing this year. Although the flowchart does help with what to do, please be mindful and patient with us as each class and case will present differently based on the amount of students masked, distanced, and vaccinated in the room. We will work closely with the teachers, and will monitor attendance records, cleaning procedures, ventilation of the classroom, etc to determine thoroughly how to proceed per incident.

- First, if the student is exposed to a positive COVID case and has been **consistently masked and distanced at least 3 feet, regardless of his/her vaccination status**, the student is permitted to safely remain in the normal in-person classroom setting and participate in extracurricular and sport activities as long as the student has no symptoms. Nurse Kate will check in with the individual daily to ensure this.
- Next, if the classroom of students exposed to a positive COVID case and students are **unmasked, not at least 3 feet distance between desks, BUT ARE vaccinated**, the contact will wear a mask indoors, as much as possible, either for 14 calendar days

or until the individual receives a negative viral (PCR or antigen) test performed 3-5 days after exposure. Vaccinated individuals may remain in the normal in-person classroom setting and participate in extracurricular and sport activities as long as they have no symptoms.

- In a different situation, if the contact is not distanced at least 3 feet, is unvaccinated, BUT has been consistently wearing a mask, the contact must continue to wear a mask indoors, as much as possible, either for 14 days OR for 7 days if the individual receives a negative viral (PCR or antigen) test performed at least 5 days after exposure. The contact may remain in the normal in-classroom setting and participate in extracurricular and sport activities as long as they have no symptoms.
- Finally, if the contacts are unmasked, not distanced at least 3 feet, and are unvaccinated, they should not attend in-person school. They should not participate in sports or extracurricular activities. They can return to normal classroom and extracurricular activities after 7 days if they have received a negative viral (PCR or antigen) test that was performed at least 5 days after exposure. If the parents/guardians choose not to test the child(ren) 5 days after exposure, then the child will have to quarantine at home until Day 10, but will have to return to school wearing a mask until Day 14 with daily check-ins with Nurse Kate.
- In every situation, if anyone tests positive, they should isolate for at least 10 days from the date of the positive test.
- Negative and positive test results are required to be reported to the school in order to properly guide the student's quarantine, as well as necessary in reporting to the Cincinnati Health Department weekly.
- Remote Learning instructions will be provided if quarantining is needed.

We are doing our very best in keeping up with resources and data coming out from ODH, CDC, and the local health departments. These are our best options in order to keep our entire school community safe and to promote in-person schooling for this academic year.

We want to keep our students in school as is normal, but we have to be safe in doing so. Masks, per situation, will be provided by Nurse Kate, or students may wear their own masks from home as masks are clean and provide good coverage. Nurse Kate will still continue to wear a mask, due to being at higher risk with her pregnancy, and will provide a mask for any child that comes into the health clinic, in the same fashion as a doctor's office.

We are well aware that this may not be your practice at home, and may not be something you're comfortable with. Again, we ask for your cooperation and support as we all continue through this uncharted territory together. Our first priority is the health and safety of our students, and we are taking the means to do so with thoughtful intention and practice.



Guidelines for Quarantine After Exposure in K-12 Classroom Settings

This chart can help guide quarantine decisions after a student or adult contact is exposed to someone with COVID-19 in the classroom setting.



*This flowchart applies only to COVID-19 exposures that occurred within a K-12 classroom setting. It is not applicable to exposure in the community, extracurricular, or sports environment.

**If masking has not been implemented, local health departments (LHDs) may use this workflow if it can be established that the person WITH COVID-19 and individuals within 3 to 6 feet of the infected person were consistently and correctly wearing masks.

LETTER TO PARENTS MEDICATION POLICY

TO: Parents/Guardian of St. Teresa Brwin
FROM: School Health Clinic
DATE: 8/2021
SUBJECT: Medication Policy

To protect your child's safety, the clinic staff will adhere to the following medication policy. It is required that **BOTH** the parent **AND** prescriber signatures are on file before any prescription **OR** non-prescription medication (depending on the school/district policy) is administered. This includes all medications including such over-the-counter products as Tylenol, Advil, etc.

Although this may cause some inconvenience, we feel that this policy is best for the continued protection of your child, and must be followed. **If we do not have your written permission and the written permission of your prescriber, the medication will not be given.** Permission forms can be obtained by contacting the clinic staff.

In order for your child to receive any medication at school, please conform with the following:

- A written request must be obtained from the prescriber and the parent/guardian. This request must include the name of the medication, dosage, time it is given during school hours, and duration. Forms are available at the school.
- A signed Prescriber and Parent Request for the Administration of Medication at School is required in order to dispense medication.
- The medication must be in its original container and, and if an over-the-counter medication, the bottle must be new with an unbroken seal. All medications must have a fixed label which indicates the student's name, name of medication, dosage, method of administration, time of administration and time interval of dosages.
- When the empty prescription bottle is returned to you, please bring the refill to school promptly.
- The medication and the signed permission form must be brought to the school by the parent or guardian. **Students may not bring medication to school.**
- Please include a photo of your child with the permission form.
- New Request forms must be re-submitted each school year, and are **necessary for any changes in medication orders.**
- If your child is taken off medication or will no longer receive it at school, please put your request in a dated, written note as soon as possible, accompanied by a prescriber's signed order to discontinue the medication. If the medication is not picked up by parents from the health aide or school office within 30 days, it will be properly disposed of.

 Medication will not be administered without a signed order from the prescriber or Prescriber and Parent Request for the Administration of Medication at School. 

Please contact the building principal or clinic staff if you have any questions. Thank you for your cooperation.



Dear Current 6th, 7th & 8th Grade Students:


